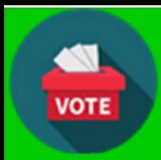

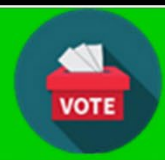

Graduate School Micro Scholarships:

Dr. Baggett shared previous plan discussed in September Council meeting for need based micro-scholarships using M&O funds which must be revisited due to funding restrictions. He suggested bringing back previous Research Assistant Grants rather than scholarships. Also allow the grants to be available to students

and faculty. Dr. Baggett will follow-up with Melinda Compton to ensure all requirements are met.

- Dr. Bradshaw suggested using funds for printing of final project/research papers. Students usually need many copies.
- Dr. Sabin suggested allowing faculty professional development items to be included as an option.
- Dr. Szabo requested allowing 3 + 2 programs undergraduate students to assist with recruitment and progression to graduate program.

Ryan Baggett: Contact Melissa Compton about fund limits on Research Grant

Graduate Assistantship Allocation/Justification Process:

- Holly working with a Professor Grabeel, prototype is currently being created
- Discussion about graduate assistant stipend which has not been increased in many years.
- Externally funded grants that include paying the stipend then the Graduate School will pay for the 3-6 hours tuition waiver.
 - Dr. Szabo asked if external grants could pay for any additional hours of tuition not paid for by Graduate School. Dr. Baggett noted to ask the funding source if this is allowable. The graduate school has no issue since it would be funded from external funds.
