


Figure One: February Graduate Council Zoom Meeting Image – 26 February 2021

SPECIAL AGENDA ITEM

We were fortunate to have Dr. Jennifer Wies, the EKU Associate Provost, join our February 2021 Graduate Council meeting. Due to a time constraint with an existing CPE meeting, Dr. Wies asked to go first, which we certainly obliged. This item was originally listed under "Good the Order" items in the existing meeting agenda.

BACKGROUND:

Dr. Wies started with an overview about why we are talking about certificates at EKU...

- At EKU, we have two distinctions of certificates: Department and University Level
- Daily, we distinguish between the two very little. However, they are very different.
- Department level is designed to be flexible and nimble but is not considered an educational program that is on the institutional transcript that is verified and certified by the institution.
- In some cases, department certificates are notated on the transcript but are not considered as an earned credential per Department of Education terminology
- University certificates are considered are considered a certified credential.
- This is a confusing distinction for all involved (Faculty, staff, and students)
- Department level certificates do not adhere to DOE definitions so it is not eligible for financial aid, cannot be verified and no proof of attainment is guaranteed.

CONCEPT:

- There is a working group of ten individuals who are looking at how we can adjust certificates at EKU to align more closely with stakeholders (students and DOE).
 Looking at policies and practices at all levels to develop a new taxonomy regarding certificates.
- Pathway for department level certificates to transition to a credential on a learner



record OR expanding the definition for university level certificates to level up the department level certificates to a university level certificate. They would then be an earned credential with the ability to access financial aid. Different pathways to continue.

• Must be addressed in the relatively short term.

GRADUATE CERTIFICATES:

• Dr. Baggett then provided an overview of graduate certificates at EKU. Please see Appendix B for the spreadsheet that was referenced and the slides in Appendix A that correspond to this topic.

QUESTIONS / COMMENTS FROM GRADUATE COUNCIL:

- CERTPs Question in the Chat CERTPs would remain unchanged under this new concept.
- Dr. Sabin asked what defines a university certificate at the undergraduate level?
 - o Dr. Wies noted that it is open to discussion at this point. According to DOE we could lower the hours for an undergraduate university certificate. For undergraduate certificates, the minimum is 24 hours.
 - o When something becomes a certified credential what comes with it?
 - Reporting and Assessment
 - Because university certificates provide financial aid, there is a necessity to report on the certificate to CPE / DOE / SACS COC Etc.
- Dr. Ashby asked what would be required to drop the minimum of the undergraduate certificate hour requirement?
 - Dr. Wies noted that the working group recommendations should be evaluated based on their research. They are looking at a number less than 24 to be more inclusive (undergraduate certificates)
 - o All will come back to CAA for discussion and input
- Dr. Sabin asked if the university was considered soft skills and technical skills credentials?
 - Professional Development (ENGAGE Program) General Education Fall 2021
 - Align employability qualities with general education starting in Spring 2022
 - With digital learner records we would have setup to conduct badging for skills and other disciplines
 - Digital learner record will be available through the Student Clearinghouse current transcript provider.



- Dr. Baggett asked what constitutes a graduate university certificate moving forward?
 - Or. Sabin noted that graduate programs (with 30 hours) somewhere in that halfway range would be legitimate (12 18 hours would be a certificate level).
 - Or. Ashby agreed with Dr. Sabin's assessment of 12 to 18 hours. He noted that if the number of hours exceeded the halfway mark would make the certificate very tedious for graduate students.
 - Or. Humphrey discussed the Autism Spectrum Disorder University Certificate that is 18 hours and it is difficult to fit that in with their graduate degree. If the number of hours exceeded more than 18 it would add substantial time to degree and make them less desirable.
- Dr. Sabin asked if the main goal of certificates to give students already enrolled in our majors something additional or is the idea to pull in non-traditional learners (boosting their specific areas?)
 - Or. Wies noted that the reason why students pursue a certificate has changed in the last 10 years. They used to see it as something they would get along the way (like a minor). Now they are a way to get a learner back into school for a credential for a specific area. Hopefully, they then decide to stay and get the whole degree after they complete the certificate.
 - o This makes it even more important to be very specific about how certificates are transcribed and what a certificate is and is not.
- Dr. Sabin asked are they seeing that the certificates are helping with job placement?
 - Dr. Humphrey noted that the Autism certificate helps the students in that area.
 The biggest pull for the certificate for Autism is for the students already in the graduate program with a desire for that knowledge.
- Dr. Shanahan asked about financial aid possibilities for the CERTPs?
 - o Dr. Wies will follow up with Dr. Shanahan.
- Dr. Baggett recapped that 12-18 hours on a graduate certificate seems to be the consensus for the graduate council.
- Dr. Wies noted that MBA on-campus may want to move those nine-hour certificates to the digital credential area. 12 hours seems to meet the trends in the graduate school community.
- Dr. Ashby asked if there would be clarification regarding digital credentials to include badges, large variance of definitions?



 Dr. Wies noted that more information and continued discussion would be forthcoming regarding digital credentials. There have been many conversations and many more to come. If there are questions please contact Dr. Wies.


















Fundamental Concepts Definitions...

HOW IS AN ACADEMIC PROGRAM DEFINED? - It's a combination of courses organized for the attainment of broad educational objectives that lead to a certificate, diploma, associate's degree, bachelor's degree, master's degree, specialist degree or doctoral degree.

WHAT IS REQUIRED OF AN ACADEMIC PROGRAM? Programs are required to articulate student learning objectives for each degree program, option, certificate and minor and to design and implement assessment measures to ascertain progress towards those student learning objectives. Academic departments are required to submit annual progress reports delineating results of student learning assessment and the use of results for improvement.

WHAT DOES THE EKU GRADUATE CATALOG SAY ABOUT GRADUATE CERTIFICATES? These certificates are awarded by the University, and students receive a formal certificate produced in the same manner as a degree diploma. Students completing these programs must apply for graduation and are assessed a graduation fee. Students earning only certificates do not receive caps and gowns and do not participate in the commencement ceremony. The university graduation fee partially offsets the production and mailing of diplomas and certificates. The University absorbs cap and gown costs for degree earners. Application deadlines for completing university certificates follow the same timeline as degree graduation.



Certificate Definitions – Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS)

Post-Baccalaureate Certificate:

 an award that requires completion of an organized program of study beyond the bachelor's degree. It is designed for persons who have completed a baccalaureate degree but does not meet the requirements of a master's degree. (IPEDS)

Post-Master's Certificate:

• an award that requires completion of an organized program beyond the master's degree but does not meet the requirements of academic degrees at the doctoral level. (IPEDS - Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System)

Gentlemen.

During the January 2021 Graduate Council Meeting, the Council discussed the recent announcement that textbooks would be provided for undergraduate students as an incentive for attendance starting in the Fall 2021 semester. The Council recognizes there are some differences between undergraduate and graduate education; however, with the increasing need for graduate degrees in many professions graduate education is becoming less optional for students and more valuable to the institution, many of these differences may not be as great as graduate-level degrees are either expected more or required in many professions. In our discussions, there was a fear that a valuable aspect of EKU's student population was being alienated from this incentive.

Reviewing the statistics, graduate students comprise approximately 20% of EKU's enrollment and generate a considerable amount of tuition revenue. In addition, graduate programs comprise a considerable amount of EKU's out-of-state enrollments. In summary, graduate students pay more for their education, help to financially support the institution and increase the reach and esteem of EKU beyond our region.

Over the last year, we have requested a concerted effort to evaluate the potential of an out-of-state flat-rate for graduate programs, and though the multiplier for graduate out-of-state tuition has been reduced slowly, the full impact of boosting the potential of graduate programs has not been realized. The incentive to receive textbooks for free, with the option to purchase at a discount after graduation and/or hold them as resources throughout their graduate programs, would benefit graduate students as much as it would undergraduate students. The ability to advertise this small incentive would also provide graduate programs with another incentive that could increase enrollment in these valuable programs. EKU currently defines itself as a school of opportunity with a public mission of access, equal opportunity and inclusion for all people so that they may grow, reach their communities, and impact the world. We believe that all graduate programs at EKU contribute to this mission and students enrolled in these programs should be provided the same incentive as undergraduate students.
