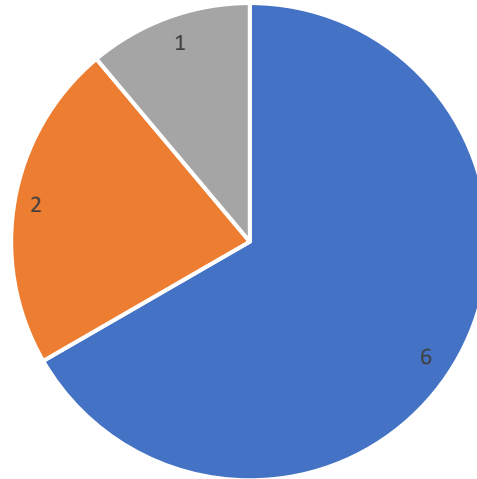

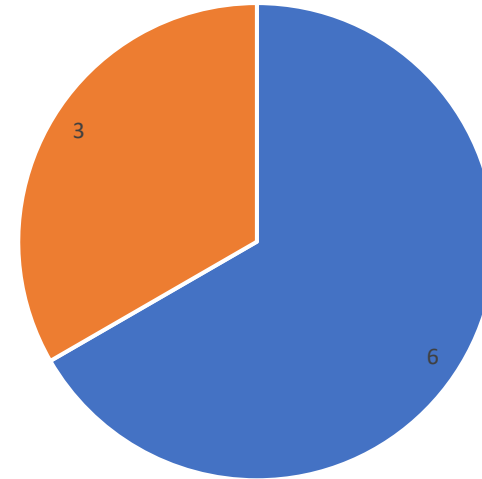

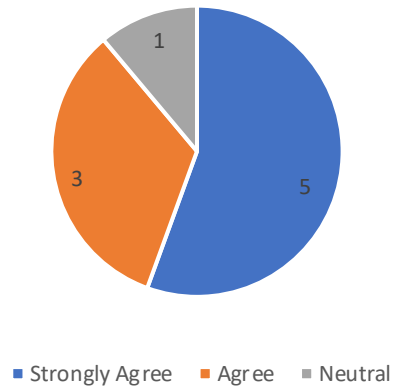

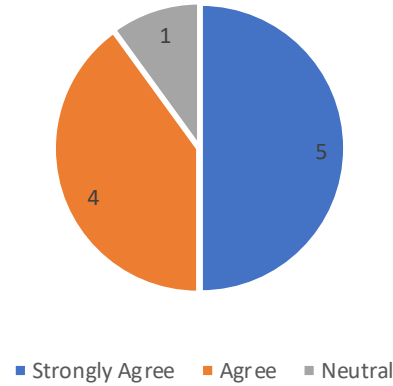

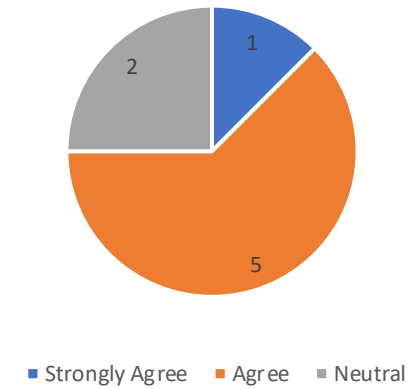
Knowledge and skills to provide effective consultation services



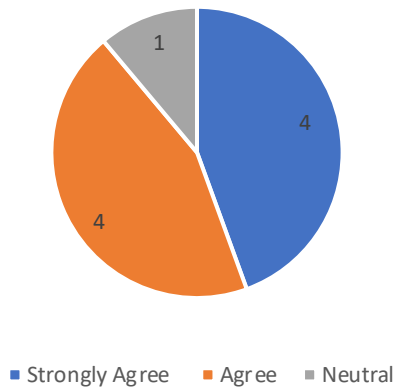
Knowledge and skills to provide effective group counseling



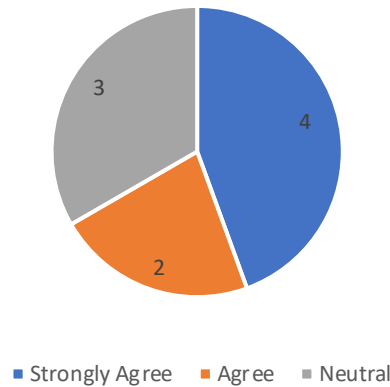
Knowledge and skills to provide effective career counseling



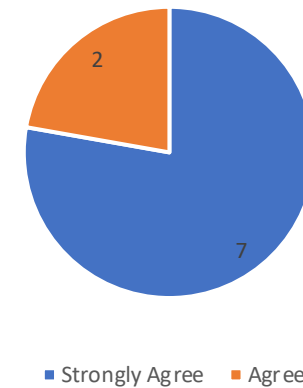

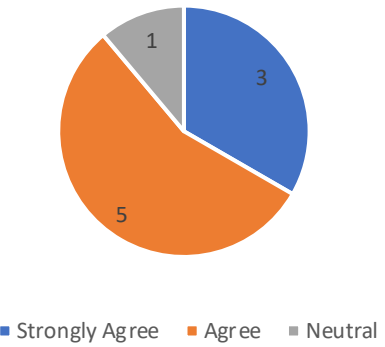

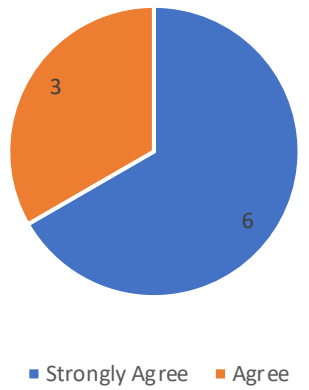
Alignment with an ethical, professional counselor identity



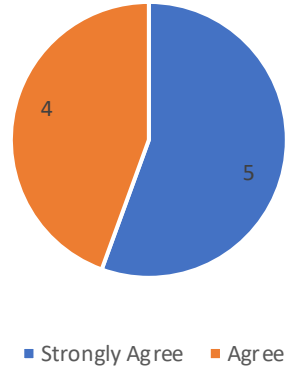
Potential for leadership skills and ability within current place of employment and/or the profession



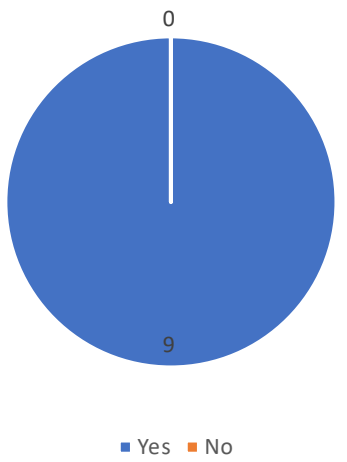

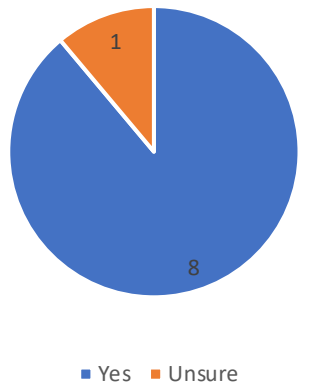
Overall, the graduate was well prepared to meet the professional, counseling needs of both their clients and their role at the current place of employment.
