"Safe to Go"

Amazon has a culture of safety imbedded as soon as an associate begins their first day. Amazon associates are trained in safety on a weekly basis, covering topics such a proper handling, slip, trip, fall prevention, and risk mitigation. Amazon hosts quarterly safety training which covered 33 safety modules to ensure associates are set up for success during their safety career. Amazon leaders receive extensive safety training within the scope of risk mitigation, root cause analysis, and incident investigations.

Amazon offers workplace, health, and safety (WHS) internships as well as a full-time university program which is targeted at new grads with an undergrad degree in occupational safety that have graduated within the past 5 years. Favorite class to teach

I can narrow this to three classes which are likely my most favorites, and those are OSH 350 – Measurement of Safety Performance, OSH 390 – Workers' Compensation and its graduate companion, SSE 822 – Workers' Compensation and Labor Law.

The subject of safety performance measurement is near and dear to my heart, and is one that I most passionate about. This endearment to safety performance measurement relates back to my graduate research work which was inspired by the frustrations I experienced in industry with how most organizations measured safety which was focusing on lagging indicators such as OSHA injury rates. My research and work to measure safety with true performance indicators/leading measures opened up speaking opportunities across the nation and is a topic that has truly been on the frontier of safety management over the last two decades.

I enjoy teaching about workers' comp because it relates to a field of law that is relatively non-intuitive for students, and it is extremely rewarding to employ the Socratic method of teaching and watch students obtain "ah hah moments" as the semesters progress.


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
